### **February 2018 Meeting Courses Presented by the Indiana Society of Professional Engineers (ISPE)**

**Presenter: David Kish, P.E., PhD.**

David Kish, P.E., PhD. is the Immediate Past President of the Indiana Society of Professional Engineers and serves as the Director of the Purdue University College of Engineering Flex Lab. Mr. Kish earned his Ph.D. in Electrical Engineering from Purdue University, and an MS in management from Krannert School of Management. In addition to several volunteer community activities, Mr. Kish is Treasurer and Director of Purdue Federal Credit Union.

#### **Course 1 of 2 *Indiana Statutes and Rules for Professional Engineering Licensure***

This course explains the role of the statutes created by the Indiana Legislature concerning the profession and the role of the Registration Board for Professional Engineers in making and administering rules contained in Administrative Code 864 IAC for engineering. This version of the course includes: information on Indiana Statutes and Rules that apply to the Practice of Engineering, the process for becoming a professional engineer, the newly adopted Computer-Based Tests for the FE exam, the Continuing Engineering Education Rules adopted in 2010 and updated in 2014.

**This course fulfills the rule requiring one hour on Indiana Statutes and Rules.**

#### **Course 2 of 2 *Professionalism and Ethics in the Practice of Engineering***

The course explains why ethics are important, gives an overview of professional codes of ethics, describes the rules of professional conduct in the Indiana Statutes and Rules, provides guidance for making value-laden decisions, and shows the value of professional and technical societies in maintaining ethical health fitness. **This course fulfills the rule requiring one hour on ethics applicable to the practice of professional engineering.**
